

What We Did



In February, students learned about polynomials. From naming polynomials by their number of terms and their degree, to adding and subtracting polynomials, to multiplying polynomials, students got an in-depth look at these fascinating structures.

Students received the results of their work on Chapter 12 (functions and sequences) at the start of the month. While students performed at an average level, their work was not indicative of their performance in class. Students were given an opportunity to take a re-test of Chapter 12 online in order to earn a higher grade. Students have until March 8th to complete the re-test online.

What's Ahead

As students move forward into March, they will review solving equations in the Algebra textbook (chapter 3).

In the last week before Spring Break, students will take two tests. One test is over polynomials and the second is over solving equations. These will be their final grades for the quarter.

Students will finish chapters 4 and 5 in the Algebra text in fourth quarter, then switch back to the Pre-Algebra text in the end to discuss Graph Theory.
